The fourth and final of the four night watches is Freedom. We focus on the Resources prayer stream.

Healing & Deliverance

In my spiritual journey, I have discovered that it's very difficult to describe the difference between healing and deliverance.

We typically associate healing with pain relief or the physical healing of infection. Deliverance is more for liberation from addiction or demonic possession.

In the Bible, we witness the crowds bringing their sick and afflicted to Jesus: the sick need healing and the demon possessed need deliverance. It seems pretty simple and easy to explain in these Gospel stories.

But when it comes to prayer, I've experienced so much overlap in praying for healing and deliverance with people experiencing an immeasurably vast diversity of pain, sorrow, spiritual attacks, persecution, troubles, failures, trauma, abuse, hurt, brokenness, and affliction.

For example, my family was involved in a church planting network where everything was going really well. We saw new believers and baptisms every month, and new gatherings springing up across our city representing dozens of cultures and languages.

Then a spiritual attack happened with an intensity I didn't even know was possible. All of a sudden, our team was torn apart at the roots, and families who had remained faithful to one another through all kinds of previous warfare decided they never wanted to see each other again. My family was part of that warfare fallout, and we were in extreme pain and overwhelming grief, feeling abused, rejected, and outcast by our closest friends.

During this season, we prayed for both healing and deliverance. The stress of broken relationships affected our physical bodies, and both my wife and I were feeling sick and exhausted more often. We also

felt directionless of what to do or where to go, because we still loved Jesus and wanted to impact the world, but we felt cut off completely from everyone we had known, loved, and served alongside for years.

We didn't just need healing for our bodies from the exhaustion, burnout, and illnesses; we also needed healing in our hearts and souls from the emotional and spiritual pain of suffering the devastation of our friendships and ministry team. We asked for deliverance from all the spiritual attacks that were so clearly successful during that time in our lives, but we also discovered later that God's plan was to deliver us from an unhealthy ministry strategy that was hurting us in the long-term although we couldn't see it at the time, and now I praise our Heavenly Father for protecting us and setting us free from a lot of false teaching that I believed and taught others back then.

So, healing and deliverance are so similar, they're like the wick and wax of a burning candle, or the roots and trunk of a fruit tree. While I do everything I can to pray in the Spirit and according to Scripture, I have stopped trying to stumble over which word to use in each prayer situation, and just let Jesus' Holy Spirit speak through me as I float down his Seraphim River.

Awakening Bridge

The Freedom Watch shares common ground with the Shalom Watch as a bridge between light and dark: shalom is light to dark, freedom is dark to light. Of all the Prayer Watches, these two are the most complex because of they occur during these special times of transition and transformation.

I call the Freedom Watch the Awakening Bridge.

The Freedom Watch begins with the Witching Hour at 3am. This hour of night is when Satan and his demon armies are the most active on earth and invasive in humans. Furthermore, this Witching Hour is when Satan's human worshippers are the most active.

They worship the Hellfire Dragon together and open up their bodies and souls to communion with and possession by demons: physical vessels of satanic warfare on our planet in every generation. Lucifer's disciples include witches, shamans, satanic priests, the demon-possessed, and anyone worshipping him and participating in witchcraft, idolatry, and summoning.

What does the advance of hell look like on earth? Here are examples of how demons enslave humans through wicked practices: adultery, rage, pride, vanity, envy, bitterness, blasphemy, addictions, cowardice, fraud, betrayal, divisions, lies, fear, lust, greed, perversion, hypocrisy, hate, idolatry, false gospels, self-indulgence, murder, demon worship, stealing, abuse, and despair.

The Freedom Watch begins at the same hour of the Devil's most fierce and powerful attacks against humanity through all of his agents and resources available to him. Demons will fulfill their nightly assignments at this time: attacking people however they were instructed with the goal of whatever forms of spiritual death they can exact before they're summoned back to hell to report on their deeds and prepare for the next night's warfare.

Around 3am is when we see the most suicides and drug overdoses, prostitution and human trafficking, and interest by humans exploring contact and communion with spirits and extraterrestrials.

The three previous night watches have all been a preparation for this final night watch, and Jesus Christ invites his Church to participate intentionally and courageously in his liberation mission. Also, this night watch by nature carries the special anointing of daybreak: when the chains of nighttime warfare are broken by the rising sun, light dispelling darkness, heat warming the cold, and creation singing praises.

The Freedom Watch is the second bridge between prayer watches. The first bridge is the Shalom Watch, when the sun sets and darkness comes. The second bridge is the Freedom Watch, when darkness fades and light arrives. Personally, I consider the Freedom Watch to hold both the greatest danger from hell and the greatest glory from heaven.

We fight the fiercest prayer battles during the Witching Hour, and we sing the loudest praises at 6am, the Daybreak Hour. We see demons and devil worshippers laboring the hardest at 3am to 4am to deceive and destroy, and then retreat back to hellfire and dark places to wait once again for the next cover of night.

Our Blazing Trees' team motto is: freedom is never free, and freedom is always fragile, but freedom is worth the fight, so let's handle freedom with care.

Everyone on our team shares common experiences of various abuse and trauma, and we understand what

it's like to follow Jesus while carrying great burdens and debilitating brokenness. Our shared struggles illustrate one of the greatest mysteries in life: why would an all-knowing perfect Creator invite broken and rebellious people to participate in his rescue mission to restore all nations to his heavenly family?

This question has haunted my mind and thoughts for years, especially when I became a leader myself and began making disciples. Why on earth would God entrust anyone into my spiritual care?

The answer from my perspective is found in the relationship between freedom and resources. The last night watch is a time for both deliverance and identity. We pray for freedom while flowing in the resources stream. This stream is the reset button on our beliefs and hopes, our struggles and setbacks. This night watch is when we remind ourselves that Jesus came for this purpose: to set us free from Satan and restore us to his eternal family.

First, Jesus came to set us free.

Second, Jesus gives us a new, secure identity.

Freedom & Identity

The sign that we are Jesus' true disciples is increasing freedom. Not the kind of freedom that says I get to do whatever I want. No, the freedom that John Baptizer described, "Less of me, more of Jesus. I must decrease, Jesus must increase."

You've seen the bumper stickers and t-shirts: HE > I

Did you know that you can believe in your mind that God is greater than us and yet still not walk with his Spirit and live for his kingdom?

Theology is not lifestyle.

Jesus' Gospel is a living message: Good News that transforms and inspires. For this reason, freedom and identity go hand in hand, they work together throughout the Freedom Watch, and indeed through all eight prayer watches.

Jesus Messiah said, "You will find freedom wherever my Spirit is welcome."

Freedom is the work God accomplishes through Jesus his Son in collaboration with us in prayer.

Our new identity through Christ, how we have been restored to God's family as sons and daughters and adult heirs, is the source, the foundation for all our faith, hope, trust, joy, and love.

Out of identity, freedom flows.

And here is where the Resources stream originates.

When we decide to follow Jesus, we discover that nothing else matters but his glory. All we are, desire, have done, and will be only has any meaning, purpose or value when we are found in Christ. The world, however, is a great big competitive game for wealth, power, fame, and personal pleasure. So, following Jesus means that we renounce all the cursed pursuits of this world to, instead, embrace Jesus and his values.

Not only does Jesus set free from the Hellfire Dragon's dungeons and the atrocity of living an empty, pointless existence; but also we see the purpose of Jesus' Holy Spirit indwelling and guiding us to become vessels of his kingdom promises and blessings through our resources and relationships.

With this understanding, we see how freedom can come to prisoners, slaves, rebels, and wanderers through Jesus' Holy Spirit. We cannot achieve freedom on our own, because Jesus is freedom. Freedom is not a place or a choice; freedom is a person. True, eternal freedom is only found in a friendship with Jesus Christ.

Jesus' freedom originates from our Abba Father's heart in heaven, so when we experience his freedom it's authentic, pure, beautiful, and powerful. Jesus' freedom is distinct from earth's freedom, because here we still have pain, sickness, disasters, and warfare.

So, we are praying in the Holy Spirit throughout this Freedom night watch aware that many are hurting and struggling around the world and some facing life-altering or life-ending choices because of their bondage and spiritual battles. We, as prayer warriors, must stand in the gap and pray for the tides of war to turn away from death and return again to Jesus.

Many disciples don't feel equipped, educated, or experienced enough to participate in this kind of spiritual warfare and courageous prayer. For this reason, we need to understand the resources available to us.

Heaven's Resources

Our first resource is our Gospel Identity. Abba Father Yahweh has adopted us into his eternal family through the blood of Jesus. When we believe in Jesus' resurrection and ask him to be our King, he transforms our identity from prisoners and slaves into free sons and daughters. We are reborn into a precious identity of eternal royalty, where our Creator and King is also our Father and Redeemer.

Jesus said in John 3 that anyone who wants to enter the kingdom of heaven must be born again.

Paul wrote in Ephesians 2 that after our rebirth, our spirits were seated with Jesus Christ up in heaven.

Paul wrote in Galatians 4 that Jesus' Spirit transforms us from servants into kingdom heirs, so that we have direct access to our Heavenly Father and can commune with him any time anywhere through Jesus.

The Gospel Identity is one of transformation and restoration. You may not feel like a prayer warrior, you may not feel up to the task of praying for the kind of breakthrough that keeps a youth from suicide, a woman from prostitution, or an endangered missionary from martyrdom, but in Christ you have been called.

Our second resource is the teamwork of the Word & Spirit. Jesus works together with his Spirit to teach and guide us in all Truth and how to pray. We don't have to read a stack of books or attend a handful of conferences or pursue academic degrees.

Available to every disciple every day of their lives is the Bible and the Holy Spirit.

As we pray through the Freedom Watch, we can dialogue with the Holy Spirit about what to pray for, how to pray, how to pray through Scriptures and what Scriptures to declare. We can ask, “Holy Spirit, whom are you directing me to pray for tonight?” and “Holy Spirit, what do you want me to ask for so that I’m praying in alignment with Abba Father’s will?”

Praying through the Freedom Watch is powerful, realigning us with who God is and what he wants, remembering that we have died with Jesus Christ and been reborn in his Spirit. We begin with who we have become because of Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross.

Jesus Messiah came to serve and suffer, so we also are called to serve him with joy and thanksgiving. We share in his desire to rescue everyone who is perishing, so they may share in our eternal freedom.

Alongside freedom is the need for resources to fulfill Jesus’ mission to all nations, so praying for freedom reminds us to pray for whatever resources are needed to be mobilized from the Church and distributed throughout the mission fields of the nations, ensuring that disciples are making disciples in every tribe, tongue, nation, and people.

We pray for financial resources to flow from the storehouses of families, businesses, churches, and organizations to the global harvest fields. We pray for a great awakening to Jesus’ calling on every disciple’s life to be generous with their finances, relationships,

time, and spiritual gifts. We pray for protection for everyone sending financial resources and assets to missionaries making disciples among unreached and unengaged peoples, tribes, and languages. And we pray for ourselves, asking our Heavenly Father if we are personally investing financially in his Great Mission.

Deliverance. Identity. Freedom. Jesus' Mission.

Many people already have developed a habit of waking up intentionally sometime before 6am, and we can be faithful and focused on prayer for freedom's firstfruits in the early hours of each new day, interceding for healing and deliverance in our generation from Satan's deceptions and generosity to facilitate Jesus' Mission through Spirit-led distribution of resources like the Church in Acts chapters 2 and 4.

As most demons return to hell right before daybreak after their nightly attacks to wait for the next set of night watches, humanity awakens from sleep and rest to prepare for the plans of the new day.

The shroud of night gives way to the first light of day.

We pray, asking our Father to help us remain in Jesus' freedom and practice generosity with our time, passions, resources, and relationships as he guides and directs our desires and decisions by his Spirit.

Revelation Verses To Guide Us

Adoption Spirit > For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received the Spirit of Adoption, by whom we cry out, “Abba, Father!” The Spirit himself testifies together with our spirit that we are God’s children, (Romans 8:15-16 HCSB)

Amazing Love > Jesus said, “For God loved the world in this way: He gave His One and Only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world that He might condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him.”
(John 3:16-17 HCSB)

Bright Morning Star > “I, Jesus, have sent my angel to attest these things to you for the churches. I am the Root and the Offspring of David, the Bright Morning Star.” Both the Spirit and the bride say, “Come!” Anyone who hears should say, “Come!” And the one who is thirsty should come. Whoever desires should take the living water as a gift.
(Revelation 22:16-17 HCSB)

Deliverer > Let all who seek you rejoice and be glad in you; let those who love your salvation continually say, “The LORD is great!” I am afflicted and needy; the LORD thinks of me. You are my Helper and Deliverer; my God, do not delay. (Psalm 40:16-17 HCSB)

Directed Steps > A person’s steps are directed by the LORD, and the LORD delights in his way. When he falls, he will not be thrown down headfirst because the

LORD holds on to his hand. I have been young, and now I am old, but I have never seen a righteous person abandoned or his descendants begging for food. He is always generous and lends freely. His descendants are a blessing. Avoid evil, do good, and live forever. (Psalm 37:23-27 GWT)

Flint > The LORD God has given me his words of wisdom so that I may know what I should say to all these weary ones. Morning by morning he awakens me and opens my understanding to his will. The LORD God has spoken to me, and I have listened; I do not rebel nor turn away. I give my back to the whip, and my cheeks to those who pull out the beard. I do not hide from shame, and they spit in my face. Because the LORD God helps me, I will not be dismayed; therefore, I have set my face like flint to do his will, and I know that I will triumph. (Isaiah 50:4-7 TLB)

Freedom > God sent Jesus to buy freedom for us who were slaves to the law, so that he could adopt us as his very own children. And because we are his children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, prompting us to call out, "Abba, Father."
(Galatians 4:5-6 NLT)

Freedom Mission > The Spirit of the LORD God is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor. He has sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and freedom to the prisoners. (Isaiah 61:1 CSB)

Generosity > Think about this: while we were wasting our lives in sin, God revealed His powerful love to us in a tangible display: Jesus Christ the Anointed One died

for us. As a result, the blood of Jesus has made us right with God now, and certainly we will be rescued by Him from God's wrath in the future. If we were in the heat of combat with God when His Son reconciled us by laying down His life, then how much more will we be saved by Jesus' resurrection life? In fact, we stand now reconciled and at peace with God. That's why we celebrate in God through our Lord Jesus, the Anointed. (Romans 5:8-11 VOICE)

Grace & Peace > May you have grace and peace from God who is, and was, and is to come; and from the sevenfold Spirit before his throne; and from Jesus Christ who faithfully reveals all truth to us. He was the first to rise from death, to die no more. He is far greater than any king in all the earth. All praise to him who always loves us and who set us free from our sins by pouring out his lifeblood for us. (Revelation 1:4-5 TLB)

Great High Priest > Therefore, since we have a Great High Priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have One who has been tempted in every way, just as we are - yet he did not sin. (Hebrews 4:14-15 NIV)

Head Over Every Power > For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form, and in Christ you have been brought to fullness. He is the Head over every power and authority. (Colossians 2:9-10 NIV)

Heart Storehouse > Jesus said, "No good tree bears bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit. Each

tree is recognized by its own fruit. People do not pick figs from thorn bushes, or grapes from briars. A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in his heart. For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of.” (Luke 6:43-45 NIV)

King Who Comes in the Name of the LORD > When Jesus reached the place where the road started down the Mount of Olives, all of his followers began to shout and sing as they walked along, praising God for all the wonderful miracles they had seen. “Blessings on the King Who Comes in the Name of the LORD! Peace in heaven, and glory in highest heaven!” (Luke 19:37-38 NLT)

Lord Jesus > For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38-39 NIV)

Mighty > You ask, “Who is this Glory-King?” The LORD, armed and ready for battle, the Mighty One, invincible in every way! So wake up, you living gateways, and rejoice! Fling wide, you ageless doors of destiny! Here he comes; the King of Glory is ready to come in. You ask, “Who is this King of Glory?” He is the LORD of Victory, armed and ready for battle, the Mighty One, the invincible commander of heaven’s hosts! Yes, he is the King of Glory! [Pause in his presence] (Psalm 24:8-10 TPT)

Morning Blessing > This promise I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: the steadfast love of the LORD never ceases. His mercies never come to an end, and they are new every morning. Great is your faithfulness. “The LORD is my portion,” says my soul, “therefore, I will hope in him.” (Lamentations 3:21-24 ESV)

Morning Relief > Sing praise to the LORD, all his faithful people! Remember what the Holy One has done, and give him thanks! His anger lasts only a moment, his goodness for a lifetime. Tears may flow in the night, but joy comes in the morning. (Psalm 30:4-5 GNB)

New Covenant > The new covenant that I will make with the people of Israel will be this: I will put my law within them and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. None of them will have to teach his fellow citizen to know the LORD, because all will know me, from the least to the greatest. I will forgive their sins, and I will no longer remember their wrongs. I, the LORD, have spoken. (Jeremiah 31:33-34 GNB)

Pathway > Here’s my instruction: walk in the Spirit, and let the Spirit bring order to your life. If you do, you will never give in to your selfish and sinful cravings. For everything the flesh desires goes against the Spirit, and everything the Spirit desires goes against the flesh. There is a constant battle raging between them that prevents you from doing the good you want to do. But when you are led by the Spirit, you are no longer subject to the Law. (Galatians 5:16-18 VOICE)

Radiant Glory > As Jesus prayed, his face began to glow until it was a blinding glory streaming from him. His entire body was illuminated with a Radiant Glory. His brightness became so intense that it made his clothing blinding white, like multiple flashes of lightning. All at once, two men appeared in glorious splendor: Moses and Elijah. They spoke with Jesus about his soon departure from this world and the things he was destined to accomplish in Jerusalem. (Luke 9:29-31 TPT)

Rescued & Redeemed > Your hearts can soar with joyful gratitude when you think of how God made you worthy to receive the glorious inheritance freely given to us by living in the light. He has rescued us completely from the tyrannical rule of darkness and has translated us into the kingdom realm of his Beloved Son. For in the Son all our sins are canceled and we have the release of redemption through his very blood. (Colossians 1:12-14 TPT)

Resistance > The Devil took Jesus to a very high mountain and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. And he said to Him, "I will give You all these things if You will fall down and worship me." Then Jesus told him, "Go away, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the LORD your God, and serve only Him.'" Then the Devil left Him, and immediately angels came and began to serve Him. (Matthew 4:8-11 HCSB)

Reward > Jesus said, "Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs. You are blessed when they insult you and persecute you and falsely say every kind of

evil against you because of me. Be glad and rejoice, because your reward is great in heaven. For that is how they persecuted the prophets who were before you.” (Matthew 5:10-12 CSB)

Spirit of Faith > At all times we carry in our mortal bodies the death of Jesus, so that his life also may be seen in our bodies. Throughout our lives we are always in danger of death for Jesus' sake, in order that his life may be seen in this mortal body of ours. This means that death is at work in us, but life is at work in you. The Scripture says, “I spoke because I believed.” In the same Spirit of Faith, we also speak, because we believe. (2 Corinthians 4:10-13 GNT)

Turn the Tides > Early the next morning Elisha's servant got up, went out of the house, and saw the Syrian troops with their horses and chariots surrounding the town. He went back to Elisha and exclaimed, “We are doomed, sir! What shall we do?” “Don't be afraid,” Elisha answered. “We have more on our side than they have on theirs.” Then he prayed, “O LORD, open his eyes and let him see!” The LORD answered his prayer, and Elisha's servant looked up and saw the hillside covered with horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha. When the Syrians attacked, Elisha prayed, “O LORD, strike these men blind!” The LORD answered his prayer and struck them blind. (2 Kings 6:15-18 GNT)

Victory Well > I trust you to save me, LORD God, and I won't be afraid. My power and my strength come from you, and you have saved me.” With great joy, you people will get water from the well of victory. At that time you will say, “Our LORD, we are thankful, and we

worship only you. We will tell the nations how glorious you are and what you have done. Because of your wonderful deeds we will sing your praises everywhere on earth.” (Isaiah 12:2-5 CEV)

Warrior’s Creed > Be humbled by God’s power so that when the right time comes he will honor you. Turn all your anxiety over to God because he cares for you. Keep your mind clear, and remain alert. Your opponent the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion as he looks for someone to devour. Stand firm in your faith and resist him, knowing that other believers throughout the world are experiencing the same kind of suffering. Almighty God, who shows you his kindness and who has called you through Christ Jesus to his eternal glory, will restore you, strengthen you, make you strong, and support you as you suffer for a little while. Power belongs to him forever. Amen. (1 Peter 5:6-11 GWT)

Way Maker > I am the LORD, who opened a way through the waters, making a path right through the sea. I called forth the mighty army of Egypt with all its chariots and horses, to lie beneath the waves, dead, their lives snuffed out like candlewicks. But forget all that—it is nothing compared to what I’m going to do! For I’m going to do a brand new thing. See, I have already begun! Don’t you see it? I will make a road through the wilderness of the world for my people to go home, and create rivers for them in the desert! (Isaiah 43:16-19 TLB)

Practicing Heaven Here & Now

Promises

- Father Yahweh invites us into a new covenant, an eternal and unbreakable covenant that does not depend on our obedience but, instead, remains forever because of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Through Jesus, anyone can enter into this covenant and become free forever. (Jeremiah 31:33-34)
- If you are a true disciple of Jesus Christ, if you have died to yourself and this world and have welcomed Jesus' Spirit within and are walking with him every day, then nothing and no one can ever separate you from God's love, kingdom, and Spirit. (Romans 8:38-39)
- Jesus' Holy Spirit helps us with our lifelong pruning: revealing and eradicating all wickedness, filling us with Truth, wisdom, and righteousness. Jesus' Spirit helps us with our desires, aligning our will with God's will so we may be pure vessels of his life. (Luke 6:43-45)
- The steadfast love of Father Yahweh never ceases. His love and mercies are fresh and new every single morning. They are thousands of waves of his blessings over every human life. (Lamentations 3:21-24)

kings of Yahweh in Christ's coming kingdom. We will behold the glory of Jesus, King of the Ages. (Luke 9:29-31)

- Jesus promises to help us overcome the battles raging in our souls. Whatever we may face in our lifelong journey, our God is good, and he has made a way for us to enjoy freedom. (Galatians 5:16-18)
- The Devil is always trying to seduce us away from our adoption through Christ. The Devil is an Accuser, condemning God's people and sending his agents to ensnare and corrupt us. Jesus' Spirit promises to keep us from falling back into fear, and instead strengthening our resilience through his presence and testimony of Truth and love. (Romans 8:15-16)
- Jesus' Spirit promises to help us know how to pray and what to pray for. He helps us pray with wisdom and gives us strength for prayer during difficult life seasons or late night watches. Jesus shepherds us through suffering and persecution of all kinds, nurturing joy and strength each day (Isaiah 50:4-7)
- Abba Father promises to help us remember the gift of his salvation through Jesus Christ, so we will not grow spiritually cold and return to our old, rebellious lives. He sees our spiritual battles and helps and protects us, delivering us from our enemies. (Psalm 40:16-17)

Prayers

- Rejoice that God is the God of both day and night.
- Celebrate the Good News that God is with us even through the darkest of nights.
- Declare that nighttime spiritual warfare takes place under the supervision of God the Father, and whatever he allows to happen through the night watches is temporary and its power and effects are limited.
- Thank God for all the angels who have been sent on protection and visitation assignments. Praise Jesus Christ who has been made greater than all the angels, he is King of Angel Armies.
- Pray that all the forces of evil become confused and their assignments canceled in Jesus' name.
- Pray for all curses and condemnation to be broken and powerless in Jesus' name.
- Pray for dreams during the final night watch, for people all over the world to have dreams of Jesus and his righteous kingdom. Pray for dreamers to wake up and know their dreams were real and place their faith in Jesus Christ.
- Pray for everyone battling addictions and perversion to be delivered from the strongholds of satanic principalities who have been at work in their lives for many years.

- Declare that Jesus' Holy Spirit is greater and has the victory over all the forces of hell. Proclaim his as the Spirit of Deliverance, Righteousness, and Peace.
- Pray for the Church for dreams of the future, prophecies and foretelling revelations. Pray for disciples around the world to have dream encounters with Jesus' Holy Spirit to understand the times they live in and depend fully upon him.
- Pray for the Church, for healing and deliverance from worldly systems, structures, and strategies that have crept into the fellowship of saints and bring deception and division. Pray for Jesus' Church to return to his design and will for his Bride.
- Jesus walked on the water during the Freedom Watch and rescued his disciples from drowning. Even Peter had the supernatural power to walk on water with Jesus. Pray for mighty displays of God's power from heaven here on earth in a way that people will experience their Creator and come to a saving faith in their Shepherd Messiah King.
- Peter denied knowing Jesus three times at his unfair arrest and trial. When the rooster crowed at daybreak, he knew what he had done and still stayed away from Jesus. Pray for people to know during this time that God will always welcome them back to his arms, no matter what they have done.
- Pray for missionaries who are struggling with direction and next steps to receive fresh revelation like Paul did in Acts 16 when he kept trying to go places on his strategy map that was not God's will.

Pray for missionaries to rest, to know that God loves them for who they are, not what they accomplish.

- Pray for divine judgment against Satan's armies. Ask God to summon attacking demons before his throne, judge them for their wicked intentions, and cast them into hellfire, sealed there until Judgement Day.
- Praise God for day break, how Jesus the Light of Nations breaks the power of the Evil One, and how Jesus' Spirit awakens all peoples to the Good News.

Practice

- Make your own list of Scriptures about healing and deliverance, put on some worship music, and pray.
- Make a list of people you know of struggling with addictions and bondage. Take your list of healing and deliverance Scriptures and declare all the promises and blessings of God over these lives.
- Open up your app for recording audio messages on your phone or computer and record yourself praying for someone. Then, send them the recording. One of the greatest gifts you can ever give someone is an audio prayer message. It's absolutely amazing to listen to someone praying for you: truly life changing.
- If you don't know anyone with addictions or bondage, carve out time to research your community and city. Tap into news about crime and problems in your region, and begin praying God's kingdom into where you live, the need.

- Pray for real freedom to saturate our generation. We've all seen and experienced temporary or limited freedom. Pray for the eternal, life-transforming freedom of Jesus Christ to change the world and return all tribes to the arms of Abba Father Yahweh.
- Pray for a great outpouring of resources from Jesus' Church to mission fields around the world. Pray for Spirit-directed generosity for both the wealthy and poor and everyone in between. Pray for all the needs of missionaries making disciples among unreached and unengaged people groups.
- Pray for a transformation in funding priorities for Jesus' Church. Myriad local churches are still using the tithe from people's income for local ministry. Jesus made it clear in Acts 1:8 that every local church is to invest in missions, including finances, in these four spaces: local (Jerusalem), nation (Judea), other cultures (Samaria), and overseas (ends of the earth).
- Organize a dawn prayer gathering with family and friends. Meet up in person or online around 5am and pray together. Pray through the Freedom Watch Scripture List, pray for freedom in Christ for our generation, and pray for a great outpouring of resources for Jesus' Great Commission worldwide.
- Check out a world map and pay attention to the timezones. Figure out when daybreaks and nightfalls occur for your friends who are living in other places on the planet and record prayers to send them: shalom for eventide and freedom for dayspring.

- Gather some disciples together in your living room for tea/coffee and discuss the Freedom Prayer watch. Ask the question, “So what?” If we know how essential this Freedom Watch and Resources Stream is to Great Commission breakthrough, what are we doing about it; what next steps can we take to make a difference and meet some needs overseas?
